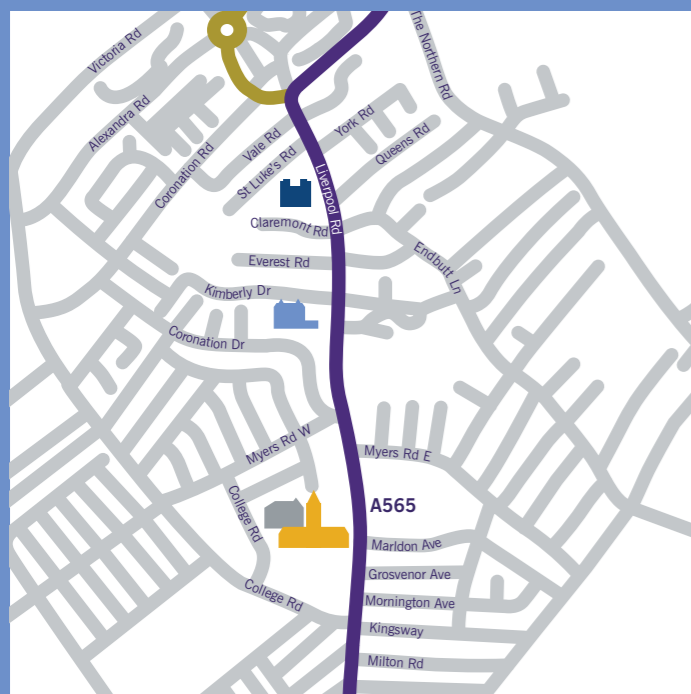

What you need to know...

Whilst academic rigour is important, we equally value the development of young people who have the necessary life skills to take their place successfully and responsibly in society. Fundraising plays a part in school life and encourages children to think about others less fortunate than themselves. This is particularly relevant in a world where there is a tendency for individuals only to see things from their own perspective.

Admissions Mixed Infants (4 - 7 years)

Entry into our infant school is for boys and girls in the academic year following their fourth birthday. Assessments usually take place in the spring term in a relaxed and happy environment. No formal skills are required but we are looking to assess their readiness to listen and to adapt to school life. They may be asked to use a pencil with some measure of control and to follow a series of instructions. We understand that some children may choose not to cooperate on a particular day, but we will always give a child a second chance! The girls and boys will have the opportunity to spend some time in Stanfield before they start in September. (This is always a more worrying time for mums and dads than for the children!)

Junior Girls (Entry into Year 3)

At the end of Year 2, the boys move to the Junior Boys' School, whilst the girls remain at Stanfield. As the children get a little older, they benefit from being together in one gender group. As a result of this move, there are usually places available in Year 3. The girls are invited in for assessment and are required to complete a series of short tests in English and Mathematics. These tests are based on key elements from the Key Stage 1 curriculum.

Other Year Groups

Vacancies are sometimes available for entry into other years and tests can be arranged at any time during the year. If a child is successful but no place is available, his or her name will be placed on a waiting list.
