Dear Parents

I hope you have enjoyed the holiday period with your daughter(s) and managed to delight in some of the wonderful weather.

Over half-term, I read *Five Minds for the Future* — a book by Howard Gardner, the Hobbs Professor of Cognition and Education at Harvard University. I believe that the ideas in the book will assist in underpinning what I am trying to achieve for pupils at MTGS. They also appear to be most pertinent at a time when our girls are involved in both internal and external examinations, with some preparing to leave MTGS to begin the next stage of their lives. Gardner's "Minds" are described as follows:

- The **synthesising** mind takes information from disparate sources, understands and evaluates that information objectively, and puts it together in ways that make sense to the synthesizer and to others
- The **creating** mind breaks new ground. It puts forward new ideas, poses unfamiliar questions, develops fresh ways of thinking and often arrives at unexpected answers
- The **disciplined** mind has mastered at least one way of thinking a distinctive mode of cognition that characterises a specific scholarly discipline, a craft or a profession
- The **ethical** mind ponders the nature of one's work and the needs and wishes of the society in which we live
- The **respectful** mind pays heed to and welcomes differences among individuals and groups, tries to understand those "others", and seeks to work effectively with them.

It is for the development of all these attributes that girls attend MTGS and I hope to continue to find ways of pushing forward the boundaries of education for the future success and opportunities for all your daughters.
