We are seeking to appoint a Visiting Music Teacher – Piano to work on a casual basis. The purpose of the role is to prepare and give lessons in piano to pupils in our Primary and Secondary School (including 6th form).

The position will see the successful applicant delivering the following key responsibilities;

Key responsibilities

- Deliver well-structured, accessible and engaging lessons to support pupils to make progress on their instrument/voice
- Organising their own timetable in accordance with the School day and required rotation system
- Arranging ensemble rehearsals when required and be willing to undertake accompaniment duties
- Provide support to the music department and undertake any appropriate tasks as requested by the Director of Music
- to attend concerts, recitals, other events and parents' evenings as requested by the Director of Music
- using a register system to record pupils' practice and attendance.
- Covering music theory in lessons and managing their time effectively so pupils receive well-rounded lessons.

- Thoroughly prepare and enter pupils for ABRSM exams with the aim of achieving excellent results.
- Be responsible for own professional development through active learning and reflective practice.
- Attend training as required including INSET days at the start of each term and a termly VMT meeting
